

- Community buy in and active participation is crucial for effective and efficient delivery of the desired results












Providing local communities with necessary tools and resources













Providing local communities with necessary tools and resources, cont...



- Capacity building and training
 programmes are essential although this
 MUST go hand in hand with giving the local
 communities with the tools and resources
 necessary to achieve the desired
 objectives; transitioning to SBE require
 investments-finance, technical and capital
 resources.
- Building financial literacy and linking local communities to financing institutions and credit service providers is essential





Creating an enabling policy environment

- Involve local communities in providing input to the relevant policies and regulations
- The level of compliance increases when input of the local communities is reflected in the policy and legal instruments

















- This is fundamental to successful implementation and scaling up of blue economy initiatives, e.g., on circular economy, on carbon credits etc.
- Alignment and developing synergies is an important element to ensure resources are used optimally and duplication of efforts avoided/reduced
- Support the local communities to get bankable projects




Current focus in the Compass' "Network Enablers:" Aspects of "Purpose-building Narratives"
